

Risk-based

- Reducing risks
- Safety first
- Needs assessed by PO
- Treatment of deficits

Strenght-based

- Goals and needs client
- Increase hope
- Recovery-oriented
- Quality of life



- Good working alliance
- Increase autonomy of client
- Joint responsibility to reduce risk
- Use of social capital and informal network
- Decrease of stigma



Risk-based

- Risk/needs assessment
- Compliance to conditions
- Risk monitoring
- Reduce risk factors
