



Child Reflex: WHAT?

The Child Reflex:

- encourages professionals to engage in conversations with their adult clients regarding parenthood, thereby ensuring that each child is considered.
- supports professionals in detecting troubling family situations or child abuse and restoring safety as quickly as possible.



Child Reflex: 6 STEPS

Step 1: Have a positive conversation about the children and parenting

Step 2: Ask about the safety at home and the well-being of the children

Step 3: Support the offender in his role as a parent


Step 4: Investigate further concerns and if parents are willing to cooperate

Step 5: Restore safety

Step 6: Involve a Centre for child abuse

Timeline



STEP 1: Have a conversation about the children and parenting



STEP 2: Ask about the safety at home and the well-being of the children



STEP 3: Support the client in their role as a parent



STEP 4: Investigate further concerns and if parents are willing to cooperate



In Mustafa's case specifically, Silke ...

A. was obligated to speak to the children

B. was not allowed to speak to the children because she is not

authorized as a probation officer

C. had the choice, depending on what felt good for her to do

Risk factors

- Parents with low education
- Parents with limited cognitive ability
- Parents with a lack of empathy for the child
- Parent who deals with others in a destructive way
- Parents with rigid and poor communication patterns
- Family with partner violence
- Pregnancy
- Financial problems and lack of perspective
- Poverty
- Weak social environment

STEP 5: Restore safety



STEP 6: Involve Centre for Child Abuse
